Preface

St Barnabas College presented a *Festival of Hope in Theology and the Arts*, 10-16 February 2025, inviting parishes across Adelaide to host hope-themed events.

St Michael's Parish Mitcham welcomed the opportunity to host:

Hymns of Hope Festival 5pm Sunday 16th February.

As part of this Festival composers and hymn writers from parishes across Australia were invited to submit original hymns on the theme of *Hope*.

The 8 New Hymns of Hope in this booklet have been chosen from the 27 submissions received for St Michael's 'Hope Hymn Project.' Entries came from around Australia and one from United Kingdom. They were divided into 2 categories:

Category A: New hymn text / Known hymn tune
Category B: New hymn text / Newly composed tune

A panel of judges was chosen from experienced clergy, church musicians, and poets, to assess the submissions.

Judging Panel:

- · Grant Eaton. Music Director St Michael's, Mitcham.

Judging Criteria:

- 1. **Alignment with the Theme**: the hymn evokes a sense of *Hope* consistent with Christian Faith, Living and Worship.
- 2. Theological Depth: the text is biblically grounded and theologically sound.
- 3. Lyric Quality: the text displays poetic beauty, accessibility, and singability.
- 4. Suitability for Congregational Singing: alignment to metre, phrase flow, memorability.
- 5. **Creativity**: brings fresh inspiration to the theme of *Hope* while remaining faithful to the rich tradition of Anglican hymn singing.

Awards:

Four awards were given in each Category - 1st Prize, Runner up, and 2 Highly Recommended. Archbishop Geoff Smith announced the winning hymn writers and presented certificates to those present at the Hymn Festival on February 16th.

1st Prize and Runner up hymns were sung at the Festival. All 8 awarded Hymns of Hope are included in this booklet.
